



Radiology department Information about your MRI contrast/dye

You have been given an injection of MRI contrast/dye to help highlight the area of interest on your magnetic resonance scan.

A reaction to the contrast/dye is extremely rare. However, if a reaction does occur, this usually happens shortly after the injection. These effects are usually very mild and do not last long.

A reaction may show itself as one of the following:

- nausea, vomiting
- headache
- dizziness
- pain, coldness or warmth around the injection site

Other effects may occur such as:

- skin rash, lumps, itchy spots or other allergic symptoms
- abdominal discomfort
- swelling or tenderness of your salivary glands on your throat
- shortness of breath
- wheeziness, difficulty in breathing or tightness or pain in the chest
- coughing, sneezing
